

Samsung/Apple

in the French part of their worldwide IP litigation against Apple concerning the parties' smartphones and tablets. This very high-profile case, which notably involved highly complex patents pertaining to the UMTS/3G technology, involved considerable commercial stakes for both parties and has re-shaped the sector of mobile telecommunications.

Samsung/Technicolor

in the most high-stakes litigation in France in the technology sector since the CJEU's landmark Huawei v. ZTE decision, in four proceedings regarding the alleged infringement of six patents relating to a range of functionalities of Samsung's products. These proceedings will have a major impact on the entire industry, as the Paris court will, for the first time, decide how SEPs can be enforced in France, how FRAND terms can be set, and what remedies can be available to non-practicing entities.

A major chip manufacturer

on an extremely high-value patent licensing issue with a major competitor, relating to computer chip architectures and associated patents.

A multinational technology company

on two infringement action based on two patents launched against Sonos, a major developer and manufacturer of audio products. In one of the actions, the Paris First Instance Court found the patent valid but not infringed. This decision has been appealed. The other action is still pending before the Paris First Instance Court.

Toshiba and DVD6C Members

in relation to the implementation of its approved patent pool, and the legality of various proposed modifications to the approved licensing programme.

A leading handset manufacturer

in relation to patent infringement claims concerning patents alleged to be essential to UMTS/LTE and video coding, as well as implementation patents.

Samsung Electronics

on the French part of their worldwide battle against Ericsson. The dispute raged throughout multiple countries over three continents. This was one of the largest licensing disputes since many years, involving the worldwide leader (by volume) in the market of handheld devices and a company presenting itself as one of the largest owners of patents in the space.

Archos

in French, German and Dutch patent infringement actions brought by Philips on both essential patents regarding the UMTS/LTE standard and implementation patents linked to mobile phones operating systems. We obtained the first ever decision by the Mannheim court finding a defendant to have infringed, but refusing to issue an injunction against him because the patented had failed to comply with his FRAND obligations.

Samsung Electronics

on an investigation initiated by the European Commission in relation to the way Samsung Electronics sought injunctive reliefs regarding a violation by Apple of SEPs.

A leading manufacturer of consumer electronics

in fending off royalty claims from a patentee allegedly owning patents essential to a standard essential patent.

A multinational technology company

on a patent infringement lawsuit brought by an individual against Android (operating system). It is the third patent case involving this company in France.
